- A **sun hat**
- A bottle filled with **fresh water**
- A **rain jacket** (as this is England!)

Please also:

- Dress your child in **clothes that cover and protect the skin**
- Apply **sunscreen** before school

Y1 Phonics Screening - reminder

Every year, children in year 1 sit the national phonics screening check. This year the screening check will take place in the week beginning 12th June. Parents and carers of children in year 1 are invited to a **meeting today**, Monday 15th May, at 4:30pm in the school hall to find out more about this check.

Sun safety

As the weather gets warmer, to help us keep your child safe in the sun at school, we ask you please to support us by:

- Applying a high factor sunscreen/sunblock (with a high UVA and UVB rating – the higher the rating, the better) to your child before nursery/school. Whilst we take precautions to limit sun exposure and offer shady spaces, much of the children's learning takes place both inside and outside. In addition to this, you may also wish to provide additional sunscreen for your child to apply during the day (which should be clearly labelled with your child's name and handed to their teacher please), as we can encourage children to re-apply this over the course of the day when the weather requires it;
- Bringing a sun hat for your child to wear (a wider brim protects their neck/ears), with his/her name inside;
- Providing your child with a bottle filled with fresh water each day to keep him/her hydrated;
- Dressing your child in clothes that cover and protect the skin e.g. covering shoulders and legs etc.

Please can we take this opportunity to share a few simple but important sun safety steps, as recommended by the NHS - <https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/healthy-body/sunscreen-and-sun-safety/>.

Sun safety tips

- Spend time in the shade when the sun is strongest. In the UK, this is between 11am and 3pm, from March to October
- Never burn
- Cover up with suitable clothing and sunglasses
- Take extra care with children
- Wear a high factor sunscreen with both UVA and UVB protection
- Wear suitable clothing, and spend time in the shade when the sun is at its hottest.

Bee Day - 19th May

World Bee Day is celebrated in May each year. The purpose of this international day is to acknowledge the role of bees and other pollinators for the ecosystem. This links with our current learning about 'Our Wonderful World'. Children are invited to wear black and yellow on the day for a donation of 50p. The HIP group will also be on the yard before and after school on this day with a game of 'guess the bees in the jar' for 20p a go.

The monies raised from this day will be split between our school (we will be investing in new plants for our tubs in the yard), and the Bumblebee Conservation Trust.

Walk to School Day - 16th May

The school council would like to invite you to walk to school, or park and stride (parking a little further away and walking for at least 5 minutes) to school, on the 16th May. The Westfield family of schools are all taking part in this active event and promoting a healthy lifestyle while simultaneously caring for the environment by reducing our carbon footprint. We would like to encourage as many children to take part in this as possible to engage with the community and support the family of schools. Children who participate in this event will receive a certificate for walking. This event will be promoted through an assembly, and a record of how children have arrived at school will be taken in class.

Educational Visits

Please complete the permission form and pay the voluntary contribution as soon as you can, so that we can finalise plans for the visits. If we don't get enough contributions, we may have to cancel the visits.

We were keen to organise end of year trips for all children in response to parent feedback, and have tried to keep the contribution that we ask parents/carers to make as low as possible. Unfortunately, though, the cost of coach hire has risen considerably. If you are having problems making the contribution, please do not worry - just come to speak to us at the School Office.

These are the guidelines that we have to follow:

From: Department for Education, Charging for School Activities

It is important to note that no child should be excluded from an activity simply because his or her parents are unwilling or unable to pay. If insufficient voluntary contributions are raised to fund a visit, or the school cannot fund it from some other source, then it must be cancelled. Schools must ensure that they make this clear to parents.

HIP Group has very kindly made a donation to enable us to reduce the cost to parents/carers, but the Group is our only available source of additional funding. If we do have to cancel the visits due to insufficient funds, we will make more plans for some interesting enrichment activities for the children. Given the rising cost of living, and your feedback about the cost of these trips, we shall be looking at other ways to enrich our curriculum through local trips that we can either walk to, or use public transport for. We shall also be looking to invite more visitors into school.

School Lunches and Census Day

On Thursday this week (18th May) our school will be conducting one of its main annual census exercises for the Department of Education. The results of these exercises **determine school funding for forthcoming years**. Part of this funding includes an allocation for the costs of providing 'universal infant free school meals'. Therefore, we would love for ALL children to try a free school meal on Thursday—it will help us to retain free school meals and secure future funding for your school.
