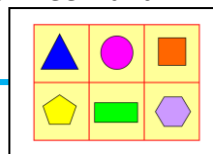


F1 Home Learning Updates



Hello everyone, this week we will be looking at a 'Book of the week', 'Shape of week' and 'Number of the week' which links to the usual format of learning in nursery. Below you will find activities to support this.



Literacy and Phonics

- Book of the week- Cinderella
 - Cinderella PowerPoint (read by Adele).
 - Create your own stick puppets of characters from the story. You can then use these to act out the story using the repeated phrases and story language.
 - Create a storyboard or mini book of the story. Think about the main parts of the story and draw a picture to show what happens. In the space underneath have a go at writing one or more words to describe what is happening.
- Phonics- Segmenting:
 - Say the sounds: When the children are used to hearing the toy say words in sound-talk and blending the individual sounds to make words, you may be able to ask them to see whether they can speak in sound-talk. Choose some objects with three-phoneme names that you are sure the child knows (cat, hat, pen etc.) and hide them in a box or bag. Allow them to see an object, and then ask them to try to say the separate sounds in the name of the object, just like the toy does (e.g. d-u-ck). You or another adult/child can then guess what the object is and blend to make the word. The child can then reveal the object to show whether you/others are right.
- Access Mini Mash through their Purple Mash login and explore some of the literacy and phonics games it has to offer.

Maths

Here are some maths activities for you to try at home!

- Number of the week- This week I want you to practise the number 14.
 - Can you count out 14 toys? Can you count 14 jumps/claps/hops?
 - Can you write the number 14?
 - Can you make the number 14 using Numicon (see resources)?
 - How many different ways can you make 14?
 - Complete the 'All about number 14' activity page (see resources).
- Shape of the week- Investigating shapes around your home.
 - Go on a shape hunt in and around your home. Can you find any objects that are shapes you don't know? How can you find out the shapes name? Try using your shape cards or maybe get a grown-up to help you find the shape on the internet. Coins are really good shapes to look at as there are some different ones you may not know yet.
 - Using lollipop sticks/sticks from the garden/straws make some of the shapes you found in and around your home.
 - How many sides did it have?
 - How many corners?
 - What is it called?



Topic

- Creative- Cinderella's carriage was made from a pumpkin; do you have any food you could use to make a carriage? Make a carriage for Cinderella using food or materials you can find in your home, be sure to check with your grown-ups first as you don't want to use something you might be having for tea! Take a photo of your carriage.
- Physical/Fine motor- Have a look at some of the other tasks such as mazes etc. included in the creative resource pack.
