ParentPay

Lots of you have now activated your ParentPay accounts, and have been booking onto our wrap-around care clubs. As with all new things, it will take a bit of getting used to, so if you have any problems or questions, call in at the School Office, or contact us at superkids@halfway-inf.sheffield.sch.uk or on 0114 2482360 and we'll try to help.

Now we have had the system for a few days, and some of you have had the chance to try it out, we have decided to change slightly the terms and conditions for Breakfast Club. It will be possible for you to book your child into Breakfast Club (or cancel your booking if necessary) up until 11.59pm the night before the session. We hope that this will be helpful to our families. The terms and conditions for Superkids after-school club will remain as before, i.e. no bookings can be made or cancelled after 11.59pm two nights before the session. You will be charged for all sessions booked, whether or not you use them. This is because Superkids after-school is regularly fully booked but not all the bookings are used, and some of our families really need spaces and can't get in.

FREE FOOD SUPPLEMENT VOUCHERS FOR OCTOBER HALF-TERM HOLIDAYS

Below are Sheffield City Council's plans to provide food supplement vouchers for 33,000 children and young people across the city for the October half-term holidays.

The Government Household Support Grant has been extended to assist with rising food and energy costs. Sheffield City Council recognises that many families continue to face financial difficulties because of the pandemic, changes to Universal Credit, and rising costs for food and energy.

A £15 food supplement voucher will be sent to the following groups to help over the half-term holidays:

- Families who claim income-based Free School Meals (FSM);
- Families who get income-assessed Early Years Support (2–4-Year-Olds);
- Young people leaving their care setting (Care Leavers).

The Plan

The Council has chosen to continue to use Edenred as the supplier of the vouchers as schools and parent/carers are familiar with the two-step process involved in downloading the vouchers.

- Voucher letters should arrive with parents by w/c Monday 16 October. The letter will include the website link for Edenred and clear instructions on how to download the voucher. Parents are asked to contact the school/establishment in the first instance if they need help with downloading or printing their vouchers.
- Any child/young person that becomes eligible for a food voucher between 29 September and 22 October 2023 will be sent a voucher letter w/c 30 October.

The Process

- As before, parents/carers need to go to the following website to redeem their vouchers www.selectyourcompliment.co.uk/ grocery
- Enter their unique 16-digit e-Code and select their chosen supermarket. Edenred give them a choice of 11 supermarkets: Aldi, Asda, B&M, Company Shop, Farmfoods, Iceland McColl's, M&S, Tesco, Sainsbury's and Waitrose.
- Parents/carers can download their vouchers for more than one supermarket. For example, £10 for Aldi and £5 for Asda.
- The downloaded E-Gift Card/Voucher will arrive by email within 24 hours. If they cannot find this, they should check their Junk/Spam folder.

Please note that codes need to be activated within 3 months of the date of issue (16 October) or they will be cancelled automatically. Once vouchers have been redeemed on the Edenred website they will be valid for 12 months.

Where can you get further help?

The FSM voucher helpline will be available on 0114 2734567, option 4, option 3, and can offer help to parents experiencing difficulties with their e-Codes or with general FSM enquiries.

Parents/carers can also contact Edenred directly with an enquiry about an eCode or voucher at freeschoolmealsparentscarers@edenred.com or telephone 0333 400 5932.
