

Subject Drivers: RE, Geography and History.

Texts:

Acrostic winter poems, posters, invitations, cards, and recounts.

History

To develop and use a wide vocabulary of historical terms, such as: a long time ago, recently, years, decades, centuries.

To develop, then demonstrate an awareness of the past, using common words and phrases relating to the passing of time

To ask and begin to answer questions about events e.g. When? What happened? What was it like?

<u>English</u>

To apply phonic knowledge and skills to read words.

To respond with the correct sound to graphemes (letters) for all 40+ phonemes (sounds), including alternative sounds.

To read accurately by blending sounds in unfamiliar words containing sounds that have not been taught.

To write a simple sentence including finger spaces and ending with a full stop.

To listen to and **discuss** a wide range of poems, stories and non-fiction.

To introduce a range of **non-fiction** texts that are structured in different ways.

Mathematics

To add an amount to and within 10.

To subtract an amount to and within 10.

Represent amounts using a part whole model.

Practise forming numbers correctly.

Identify 2D shapes.

Identify 3D shapes.

To Identify properties of 2D and 3D shapes.

To look at different beliefs and religions.

To ask and respond to questions about what communities do.

Recall and name different beliefs and practices, including festivals, worship, rituals and ways of life.

To understand that you can find information from a website.

To understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the UK.

Home learning ideas:

Practise current Phonics Phases 2-5 (sent home in packs).
