The meeting will share with you information about the screening check, including what it is, who will be running it and how it will affect your child. Attendance

Good attendance and punctuality at school are critical for your child's education.

One of our targets is to increase our overall attendance and, to this end, we monitor attendance of all children, aiming for everyone to have attendance that is at least 94% or more. If your child's attendance falls below 90% we will be in touch to let you know, and offer support where needed to help to improve this.

Arriving at school on-time is also critical. As you are aware, we prioritise reading, as it is reading that opens the door to other learning. All our phonics lessons start at 9am and, therefore, children arriving regularly after this time are missing out on key learning.
