#### Welcome back

**Welcome back!** We hope that you had a lovely week off, and feel rested and ready for this term. As you know, this term is a busy one, with lots of exciting Christmas events. Dates for these events will be shared with you over the coming weeks, and updates published in the newsletter.

#### **Attendance**

Good attendance and punctuality at school are critical for your child's education. One of our targets is to increase our overall attendance to ensure that all pupils are getting the best start in life. Last half term you will have received your child's attendance certificate. We monitor attendance of all children, and are aiming for children to have attendance that is at least 95% or more. Attendance that falls below 90% starts to become a concern. **If your child's attendance last half term was below 90%, you will receive an attendance awareness letter this week.** 

Arriving at school on-time is also critical. As you are aware, we prioritise reading, as it is reading that opens the door to other learning. All our phonics lessons start at 9am and, therefore, children arriving regularly after this time are missing out on key learning.

Should you require any further support with your child's attendance or punctuality then please come and speak to us.

#### **ParentPay**

Lots of you have now activated your ParentPay accounts, and have been booking onto our wrap-around care clubs. As with all new things, it will take a bit of getting used to, so if you have any problems or questions, call in at the School Office, or contact us at <u>superkids@halfway-inf.sheffield.sch.uk</u> or on 0114 2482360, and we will try to help.

Please note that from now on, charges will be applied for wrap-around care should your child not use it when they are booked in, or if you do not cancel it in time. As reminders:

#### **Breakfast club**

You are able to book your child into Breakfast Club (or cancel your booking if necessary) up until 11.59 pm the night before the session.

#### Super-kids after-school club

#### No bookings can be made or cancelled after 11.59 pm two nights before the session.

You will be charged for all sessions booked, whether or not you use them.

Just a note to those of you who get a 10% sibling discount when using Superkids after-school wrap-around care club—any discounts will appear as a Record Adjustment. The discount is only credited to the youngest child's account, and is added after the session at which they were both present. We do not give the sibling discount in advance, as there may be some days when both/all siblings are not present at the club.

To those of you who have not activated your child's account yet, please do so soon. Every child received a paper letter with their activation codes detailed, so please check your child's book bag if you have not seen it. If you already have an account with ParentPay, e.g. with Halfway Junior School, simply click 'Add a child' and follow the guidance.
